This is the deadline for advisors to send in their affiliation forms for new members to me (my e-mail is listed on the back page). From there, I will figure out which chapter from the All Star Team gained the highest percentage of members. The chapter that wins will get to send up a representative at state to throw a pie in the face of their region chairperson. If a Junior High chapter wins, their representative gets to pie the Jr. High Rep. *If your chapter doesn't win the region level, then your chapter is out of the running for state level.

Regional Competition

This will take place throughout the month of September. Advisors will send their affiliation forms of new members gained during the month of September to their region president so that we can keep track of new members added per chapter.

What happens next?

The chapter that gains the highest percentage of new members throughout the month of September will be awarded a prize at their Region meeting. The Region chairperson will pick out the prize, and the winning chapter will send up a representative to accept the award. The chapter that wins the region competition will be placed on the All Star Team, and from there a winner will be chosen for the state competition.

The chapter that wins each region will be placed on the All Star Team. The All Star Team will have 6 chapters on it, one from each region. From there, the chapter who won their region level will have the opportunity to recruit more members, and send those forms into me by February 18th. Then, a winner will be chosen based on percentages.

So what is with the percentages?

We do not want smaller chapters to be forgotten. So in order to make sure that the bigger chapters do not have an unfair advantage, we have decided to judge the competition based off percentage of members gained. This means that if a chapter with 100 members, gains 25 members in the month of September then they have increased membership by 25%. On the other hand, if a smaller chapter only has 4 members and they recruit 2 more, then they have increased membership by 50% and would have a better chance of winning the competition.

Rookie of the Year

In addition to the regular competitions and the All Star Team, One rookie of the year will be chosen from each region, and will be awarded with a certificate and recognized at state. Rookies of the year will be chosen based off involvement in the community and chapter, and can only have 1 year of FCCLA experience prior to the current school year. Advisors will fill out the Rookie of the Year nomination form and send the completed form to their region president, who will then choose the Rookie of the Year for their region. Each chapter will get one nominee for Rookie of the year.

Most Valuable player

The MVP award is just like the Rookie of the Year award, the only difference is that MVPs can be any age and can have more than one year of FCCLA experience. MVPs will be chosen based on involvement in FCCLA at the local, region, and state levels; as well as their involvement in the community. They will also be awarded a certificate at state.
