As the school year has started the Faulkton members have quickly gotten to work with a "Be Bold Wear Gold" childhood cancer awareness fundraiser. The team sold 410 shirts and raised \$1,350 through a yard line fundraiser to donate to the Kayden Hammond Foundation.





Another event put on by our chapter members was Tackle Pink. This group sponsored a "Flock your Yard" fundraiser to raise funds for the Faulk County cancer support group and Susan G. Koman Foundation.

The Dig Pink fundraiser held a bake sale and teamed up with the volleyball team. It was decided that these funds would go to the Vern Smith Fund to assist the Gettysburg AD and football coach with his fight against cancer.

Cade Leonhardt and Spencer Melius recently organized "Tailgating for the Trojans and Troops." This event highlighted the kick-off of the football post-season and veterans. The FCCLA members organized a tailgating meal, Trojan fire-ups, and a live music event with the SD National Guard. All proceeds from this event are going to support a veteran hunt in Faulk County.


