CURRENT TRENDS TEAM

The SD FCCLA Current Trends Team for the 2021-2022 has chosen the topic "Social Media's Effects on Wellness". As a society, we have been influenced by the negative and positive effects of social media. NATIONAL OUTREACH TEAM

This month the National Outreach Team project is emotional wellness. Emotional Wellness includes your ability to reach out for help, manage your emotions, and feel content with your life

Our motive is to encourage members to find positive role models on the internet! Spending more time with people in person and sharing gratitude can help your emotional wellness.

Social media can lead to teens internalizing issues more than usual. Spending too much time looking at other's lives on social media can make teens feel left out, or that their own life is "boring". Following negativity on the internet can lead teens to be more susceptible to low self-esteem and depression.

We have found that 45% of adolescents report that they are online "almost constantly. This can take them away from their day-today life. Teens can begin to feel left out or alone when looking at other's lives through social media.

Another thing we have found is 50% of all mental illness beings by age 14 and 75% by age 24. It is important to recognize these illnesses early on and give teens access to help and provide safe spaces. Mental health plays a large role in your emotional wellness.

PROJECT EXAMPLES AND IDEAS

- Make posters with hotlines for members to reach out to. - Challenge members to find a positive role model on social media. - Have members record 3 times they reached out to someone for help. - Have an "unplugged" chapter event. - Make "Thank You" cards for people in your school/community who have supported your chapter. - Take a few days to try different stress-management techniques. - Have members make morning/night routines or put events on a calendar. - Put up posters promoting optimism/positivity. - Challenge members to share a positive message on social media.
