One of the new projects this year focused on the NICU of Avera in Sioux Falls. A group of students wanted to deliver the baskets in the month of September because it is National NICU Awareness Month. Items that were put in the patient basket were swaddle blankets, two washcloths, lotion, sticky notes, Chapstick, waters, and a deck of cards. Items that were donated to the nurses were granola bars, waters, candy bars, pens, and beef and cheese sticks. In total, 40 baskets for



NICU families were donated and 2 nurse baskets full of goodies that the nurses could share. Another exciting and new project was a revamped Veteran's Day Program. On November 10th, twelve Veterans came to the Corsica-Stickney High School to share their stories of when they served in the military with the students. They C-S chapter felt like there was a disconnect between students and Veterans and they wanted to strengthen the communication between the two groups in the form of an untraditional Veteran's Day program. The Veterans were served coffee and donuts and shared stories of when they served, where they served, different memories of their time in the military, and brought many items of memorabilia showing their time in the military. Students were very engaged in the conversations and learned a lot. There was a lot of praise from students and the Veterans who shared stating they liked this format for a Veteran's Day celebration and will hopefully continue it in the future.
